



Job Title: IT Development Specialist

Dublin Centre for Clinical Research (DCCR)

The DCCR is a collaboration between the 3 Dublin medical schools, TCD, UCD and RCSI, jointly funded by The Wellcome Trust and the Health Research Board. Its remit is to establish a clinical research network that will enable collaborative research between the Dublin teaching hospitals and academic institutions.

The DCCR is seeking to recruit an IT Development Specialist, to be located at the RCSI Education & Research Centre at Beaumont Hospital in Dublin. This appointment will be for an initial 12 month period.

The successful candidate will work in an exciting and dynamic environment with the challenge of developing and implementing Information Systems based solutions in the clinical research field.

You should be able to work well either as part of a team or as an individual, with the expertise to take ownership of projects from concept to implementation.

Purpose: To design, develop, implement and support software solutions to meet the requirements of DCCR approved clinical research projects

Requirements:

- Minimum 4 years application development experience
- Proven ability to take complex requirements from non IT users and design, develop and implement suitable solutions.
- The experience and skills to work with users at various levels in the design, development and support of software solutions.
- Good communication skills - both verbal and written.
- Ability to learn quickly and adapt to new development tools.

Technical Skills:

- SQL Server, C#, Asp.Net
- Database design and development

- Development & deployment of web based applications with an expert knowledge of security standards required.
- Windows Server administration desirable but not essential
- VB programming desirable
- Experience of MS Sharepoint would be a plus.

Responsibilities:

- Design and develop software solutions that meet user requirements and the technical architecture and standards of the DCCR.
- Provide first line support to users post implementation.
- Work under the direction of the Clinical Informatics Manager, but also on ones own initiative where appropriate.
- Work in conjunction with other members of the DCCR IT development team, located in other institutions, on larger development projects.
- Communicate with the Clinical Informatics Manager at all stages, ensuring development is conducted in line with DCCR objectives.
